

Two months ago he started work as a volunteer at the local Oxfam shop.


"Every week is different. Sometime I sort the stock, or help at the till. I sorted out the Christmas cards last week".

started a college course called ECDL.


In the beginning staff will support me in college, but eventually I want to go on my own. I really want to be able to design my own publishing programme.
